The Acquisition Process of E-resources

The acquisition process of e-resources is a complex and evolving area within library and information science. It differs significantly from the acquisition of traditional print materials. Here's a breakdown of the key stages and considerations:

1. Selection and Evaluation:

Needs Assessment:

- Understanding the information needs of the user community (students, faculty, researchers).
- Analyzing curriculum requirements and research priorities.

1.2 Resource Evaluation:

- Assessing the content's relevance, quality, and authority.
- Evaluating the platform's usability and accessibility.
- Considering factors like subject coverage, currency, and vendor reputation.
- Utilizing tools like user surveys, faculty recommendations, and reviews.

Trial Access:

• Requesting trial access to databases and e-journals to evaluate their suitability.

2. Licensing and Agreements:

Licensing Negotiation:

- Negotiating licensing agreements with publishers or vendors.
- Carefully reviewing terms and conditions related to access, usage, and sharing.
- Addressing issues like permitted users, simultaneous access, and interlibrary loan provisions.

Copyright Compliance:

• Ensuring compliance with copyright laws and licensing restrictions.

3. Procurement and Access:

- Vendor Management:
- Establishing and maintaining relationships with vendors.
- Managing subscriptions and renewals.
- Addressing technical support issues.

- Access Provision: Setting up access through IP authentication, usernames, and passwords.
- Integrating e-resources into library catalogs and discovery systems.
- Consortia purchasing, where multiple libraries group together to gain better pricing.
- Financial Management:
- Budget allocation, and tracking of expenses.

4. Ongoing Management:

Usage Monitoring:

- Tracking usage statistics to evaluate resource effectiveness.
- Gathering user feedback.
- Technical Support:
- Providing technical assistance to users.
- Troubleshooting access problems.

5. Digital Preservation:

- Addressing the long-term preservation of digital resources.
- Ensuring ongoing accessibility and usability.
- Renewal and Evaluation:
- Periodically re-evaluating the e-resources, and making decisions on weather to renew subscriptions.

Key Considerations:

- Technological infrastructure: Libraries need adequate technology to support e-resource access.
- User training: Educating users on how to effectively use e-resources.
- Rapidly changing technology: Keeping up with new e-resource formats and platforms.

As e-resources have become indispensable for modern libraries, providing users with convenient access to a vast amount of information, a well-defined acquisition process is crucial for libraries to effectively manage their e-resource collections and meet the evolving needs of their users. While specific workflows may vary between institutions, the above general stages are largely commonly involved.

Professor (Dr.) Ramesh C.Gaur is a distinguished scholar, administrator, and expert in library and information sciences, digital preservation, digitization, digital archiving of archival material, and cultural heritage management, currently serving at IGNCA, New Delhi. Biginfo spoke to him on various professional issues. Some excerpts:



BI: Please describe your professional journey for the benefit of young LIS professionals.

RG: A Ph.D. Fulbright Scholar from Virginia Tech, USA, I currently currently serve as Dean (Administration) and Director & Head of the Kala Nidhi Division at the Indira Gandhi National Centre for the Arts (IGNCA), Ministry of Culture, Government of India. He is also in charge of key national projects, including the Aatmanirbhar Bharat Centre for Design (ABCD), the National Mission on Cultural Mapping (NMCM) Project, and the Reorganization of Artworks & Aesthetics Projects undertaken by IGNCA at various institutions. Have earlier worked at IMT, Ghaziabad, TIFR, Mumbai, MDI Gurgaon, and JNU, New Delhi, in various capacities.

BI: Please describe some of your recent achievements and contributions while working at increasingly responsible positions.

RG: I played a key role in conceptualizing and executing the Sri Aurobindo tableau for the Republic Day Parade, played a pivotal role in launching 10 PG Diploma courses and five certificate courses, as a Member of the International Advisory Committee of UNESCO MoW Programme in individual capacity and In-Charge of the Nodal Centre at IGNCA, successfully inscribed four major Indian documentary heritage works: Ramcharitmanas; Panchatantra, Abhinavagupta Manuscript Collection and Sahrdaya Lica-lokana; Served As Director (Additional Charge) of NSD, successfully restored academic and cultural activities and OSD of the Indian Institute of Heritage.

BI. As Librarian of India's top art & culture centre, share with our readers some of your contributions in the area of preservation of art and culture material.

RG: I Led a UNESCO-supported project on the Mapping of Archives in India, resulting in a comprehensive publication and an online directory of Indian archives. Carried out documentation of Tribal & Indigenous Languages (UNESCO Project) – Successfully led a UNESCO-backed project on the Tribal and Indigenous Languages of India, culminating in a publication detailing the current status of all languages in India, developed unicode-Compliant Font for Manuscript Translation – Spearheaded the development of 'Vedakshar', a Unicode-compliant font for manuscript translation—the first such initiative at IGNCA., undertook a tribal survey and documentation project on traditional healing practices in select Northeast Indian states; published over 20 volumes of the descriptive catalogue of manuscripts housed in IGNCA's Kala Nidhi Division, making rare collections more accessible to scholars. (besides the online catalog and digitization of manuscripts at IGNCA,

BI: As a Librarian , Professor , and administrator , how do you manage to multitask your work so successfully ?

RG: Balancing multiple roles as a Library Leader, Professor, Administrator, and International Library and Heritage Expert requires strategic planning, commitment, and effective leadership. I maintain a round-the-clock working attitude with strong time management skills, ensuring that every task is handled efficiently. Prioritization and structured scheduling allow me to manage diverse responsibilities without compromising quality.

While leading from the front by actively, I empower my team by giving them ownership of success while taking responsibility for any challenges. This approach fosters confidence and a collaborative work environment while regularly monitoring and following -up encourage innovative thinking and efficiency within the team. By integrating these principles into my routine, I strive to contribute effectively by maintaining work and life balance.

BI: As someone closely associated with several government agencies, do you feel the need for a single point of contact for addressing the library maters.

RG: Fortunately, I have had the honour of heading or being part of over 100 national and international committees in the field of libraries, archives, and other heritage sectors. These experiences have reinforced my belief that Galleries, Libraries, Archives, and Museums (GLAM) are deeply interrelated and serve as the repositories of our collective legacy. Given their crucial role in knowledge preservation and dissemination, I strongly recommend the establishment of a single controlling body to ensure the effective and efficient management of these institutions.

BI. Please share your views on emerging information. Landscape and challenges before libraries.

RG: The information landscape is rapidly evolving, and libraries are transforming into dynamic Learning Resource Centres rather than just repositories of books, journals, and electronic resources. With the advent of digital technologies, artificial intelligence, and open access resources, the traditional role of libraries is being redefined to support experiential learning, storytelling, and digital education—all of which align with the vision of the New Education Policy (NEP) 2020. This policy is learning-centric and emphasizes a multidisciplinary, holistic, and skill-based approach, making libraries integral to modern education.

To meet the challenges like digital divide and resource crunch, libraries should offer digital literacy programs, promote open access platforms, hybrid learning models, inclusive access to knowledge, adequate training in areas like digital curation, AI-driven information services, and data management, explore innovative funding models, public-private partnerships, strengthen resource-sharing networks so as to maintain sustainable high-quality services and, thus, transform libraries into centres of lifelong learning, innovation, and knowledge democratization.




